## **1. Course Description**

### **1.1. General Description of Course Content**

This model course provides the necessary information and guidance to those within a Municipality, Port Administration or Port Authority to perform the duties and responsibilities of a Port Industrial Complex Security Official

In particular the duties and responsibilities with respect to the security and connected safety of a port industrial complex, for developing, implementing, maintaining and updating the Port Security Plan (depending the responsibilities concerned) and for the participation or development/implementation of advisory boards such as a Port Security Committee and/or Port Security Integration Board.

Implementation and Integration of Emergency Response planning with respect to safety and security into one Management System, avoiding conflict and maintaining a level playing field.

### **1.2. Subjects, competences**

The candidates will be able to demonstrate adequate knowledge, understanding and proficiency of the competences and or requirements listed below:

1. Conducting an internal assessment based on National Security Priorities.
2. Participation or Development/implementation of required Advisory Boards; a structured approach towards effective communication and co-operation .
3. Development of an initial Port Security Plan or annexes of existing plans focused on each Maritime Security Level; submission for approval and thereafter the implementation and maintenance of the Port Industrial Complex Security Plan.
4. Monitoring within the Port Industrial complex the status of all Port Facility Security Assessments and evaluations
5. Ensuring the Port Industrial Complex Security Plan is modified, as appropriate and that alternative arrangements if any are implemented and maintained.
6. Development of strategies to increase awareness, decrease vulnerability, increase response readiness and mitigate consequences in each security level.
7. Identifying shore-based and maritime security resources and their functional capability.
8. Identification of shortfalls in Emergency Response Management planning for each security level.
9. Methodology to monitor and ensure compatibility between the Port Security Plan and any other national plans such as a Regional Response Plan.
10. Methodology to ensure the individuals having a roll under the Port Security Plan (PSP) are trained and exercised.
11. Submit interim reports to aid in analysis of resource requirements, possible legislation change proposals.
12. Methodology to maintain correct procedural guidelines when handling, assessing or producing security sensitive information.

### **2. Course Organization for Participants**

The course will be a system approach incorporating the ISM procedural structure. Training tools for continued education to port staff.

The combined educational training team will consist of members with sea experience, maritime security matters and knowledge of the requirements of Chapter XI-2 of SOLAS 74 as amended and of the ISPS Code.
